Why receive care abroad?

ACCESS BY PATIENTS:


- 46 million Americans (18% of population <65) were without health insurance in 2007
- 90 million Americans (30% of population <65)
 spent a portion of 2006 or 2007 without coverage

COST TO EMPLOYERS:

- Average cost increased by 5% from '06 to '07;
 general inflation during the same period was 3.9%
 and wage increase 3.5%
- % of firms offering retiree benefits have declined steadily
- Globalization and increasing # of expatriates

How widespread is medical travel?

- Lack of comprehensive data
- The Deloitte 2008 Medical Tourism Report:
 - Estimated 750,000 Americans traveled abroad for care
 - 39% said they would, if cost was half and quality was comparable
- McKinsey Report on Medical Tourism (2007)
 - 60 billion USD worldwide, 100
 billion USD in 2012



Various arguments against medical travel

- Quality
 - Variations in care across the US
 - External, objective quality evaluation
- Follow-up care
- Risks associated with long flights
- Blood safety


- Scheduling of medical appointments with follow-up care (pre-op and post-op evaluation)

- Translation/interpretation












DEIK-TAIK Health Committee

- In 2008, the Health Committee was renamed as DEIK/TAIK Health Committee expanding its scope to countries beyond the US




